Profile: Intercity; 2650 Ethnically Diversified students; Grade level - 9-12

Fact: Students repeating I.S.S. prior to implementation 83%; after implementation 4%.

Bellows Falls High School, Windham Northeast Supervisory Union, Bellows Falls, VT

Profile: Rural District; Student Population – 600; Grade Level – 9-12

Fact: Total referrals the year before implementation was 2260. The total number of referrals the year after implementation was 860.

Three Rivers School (K-8), Bend, OR

Profile: Rural School District; at-risk student population, 410 students

Fact: Daily discipline referrals to dean's office prior to implementation 30; after 3.

Profile: Large urban school district; 2100, Ethnically diversified student population; 6-8

Fact: 203 Discipline cards issued the first semester. 202 students stopped negative behaviors; one continued.

Jackson Elementary School, San Diego City School District, San Diego, CA

Profile: Urban Inner-city School; Student Population – 1100 Ethnic Diversity; K-5 **Fact**: Suspensions went from 51 per year prior to implementation to 1 per year after.
